School trip to Hatfield House

On 10th May, Forms IV and V will be visiting Hatfield House.

Hatfield House is steeped in history (Hatfield Palace was the childhood home of Queen Elizabeth I) and our visit will provide lots of opportunities for cross curricular learning. We will begin the day with a guided tour of the house given by specialist staff at the venue. The tour will provide a chance to see some Tudor portraits up close and to learn more about life in Tudor times. We will then spend time in the Park and the West Gardens. There will be time for a picnic in the grounds followed by some outdoor sketching focusing on the architecture of the buildings and plants growing in the gardens.

The girls will be travelling by coach, leaving at 10am and returning at approximately 3.30pm.

Each girl will need to wear their blazer, bring their cagoule and enough water to last throughout the day. A packed lunch will be provided by the school kitchen and your daughter will have the opportunity to choose her sandwich filling beforehand.

The cost of this visit will be £18, which will be debited to your daughter's account. If we do not hear from you to the contrary by 24th March we shall assume that you give permission for your daughter to attend this trip.
