What we have been learning this week

Mathematics: This week has seen the girls tackling the topic of Measurement. We have discussed a range of different units (metric, capacity and mass), and also the importance of measuring accurately. Today's lesson saw the girls measuring a variety of objects, from books and pencils to their own heads!

This week's homework is an opportunity to show what they have learnt with the task being to show, accurately, a range of mass totals on a scale. Please encourage them to use a ruler and draw straight lines from the middle point.

English: This week has seen continuing with our 'Three Little...' stories. The girls have been using self-assessment, in order to improve their versions of the story. There have certainly been some interesting endings to the story! We have also been adding actions to help to remember the story. There are certainly some creative actresses in the class!

This week's homework, 'Native Trees', is a comprehension activity. The girls have been improving their comprehension skills, and this will give further practice.

Geography

This week we have continued to look at the Continents and Oceans. The girls have been identifying countries and capital cities from around the globe, as well as facts about the continents.
